To the Wilton ZBA,

I am writing in regards to the Kennedy Gravel Permit Appeal, currently in front of your board. As a resident of Wilton, and former town planner in NH, several issues immediately cause concern for me with this appeal.

In reading through the town's guiding document, the Master Plan, this appeal seems to directly conflict with several goals in the natural resources, traffic and cultural/historic resources section.

It also contradicts Wilton's Zoning Ordinances section 12.4, regarding the prohibited activities in the Aquifer Protection District. Subsequently, it also conflicts the State of NH RSAs regarding aquifers.

I also have great concern for the integrity of the intersection of Route 101 and Isaac Frye Highway. This intersection's grade and sight line, as well as traffic volumes are a current danger, without adding heavy trucks on a regular basis.

In addition to these concerns, this is an issue the town has already voted against in the March 2006 Town Meeting.

I have every confidence that the Zoning Board of Appeals will uphold and maintain the integrity of the laws and wishes already communicated by the town of Wilton, which affect the outcome of this appeal.
